# **Scout Troop 44's Newest Eagle Scout**

Jack Horn was awarded the Boy Scout Eagle rank during a Scout Honor Court held at Paradise Church on Sunday afternoon June 26. The Eagle Scout rank is the highest achievement in Boy Scouting and since 1912 more than two million Scouts have earned the rank.

Completing a community project is a requirement for the Eagle award. For his project Jack constructed and installed a 8-foot wood cross and two benches placed in the Peace Garden located on the southwest corner of Paradise Church property. In addition, Jack added electric lights inside the nearby gazebo and increased the paver bricks on the walkway.



The ceremony began with an invocation by Rev. Dr. David Anderson, followed by a proclamation from Mayor Pat Fallot, stood for the Presenting of Colors, the Pledge of Allegiance and the recitation of the Scout Oath. Troop 44 Scoutmaster Kraig Ossler presented the rank. Among the nearly 50 persons attending included his mother Melanie Jackson and father Jeff Horn, grandfather David Jackson and uncles Jerry and Tom Jackson, all of whom are Eagle Scouts. A senior at Louisville High School, Jack following graduation he plans to attend college and study computer science. Following the ceremony there was a light lunch in Paradise's Fellowship Hall.



# Tuesday Morning Bible Study

### "The Chosen" Series

Our Tuesday Morning Bible Study Group is going to take an exciting journey. And we want you to join us.

Beginning on **Tuesday, September 5**<sup>th</sup>, we will begin watching The Chosen, the Netflix-styled series about the ministry of Jesus during our Bible Study.

- October 24<sup>th</sup> Episode 8 "I Am He." Mark 2:13-17; John 4:1-42

We are so excited to start a new year, we have many great things planned and can't wait to get to know our new students. We will follow the Louisville School calendar throughout the year, and we are open Monday through Friday, 6:30am to 6:00pm.



We teach a few different curriculums: Touch Math, Creative Curriculum, FUNdations, and our ministry program, Orange. Since we have been teaching and fine-tuning these over the past few years, we are happy to say our Preschool students entering Kindergarten have great success. This school year we sent 100 students to Louisville City Kindergarten and 15 students to other school districts.

Starting this year we have 20 Kid Watch staff members, a special welcome to our new staff, Kieghly Garland, Lexi Sizemore, Season Kerr, Chris Seemann, and Kerri Bucher. We are also excited to announce we will be starting our year with 300 students.

#### OCTOGENARIAN OPINIONS from Zora Plum

I once heard of a mother who would cook a really great meal on Sunday and before the table was cleared would announce, "Hold on to your forks! The best is yet to come." Of course, she was talking about dessert, but I often think about it in conjunction with our lives. There are a lot of octogenarians here at Paradise. Do we get up every morning eager for the day to start thinking that the best is yet to come? After all, we are supposed to be living in our *Golden Age*. Everything is great, right?

Now that many of our friends and relatives are gone, as well as the life we knew, it is sometimes hard to keep a positive attitude. We could sit all day and complain about everything: the weather, the grandchildren don't visit, the neighbor's dog barks too much, or it is too hard to get out of the chair. The fact is that complaining doesn't fix the problem, it only exacerbates it.

In 1952 Norman Vincent Peale wrote a book that is still in the bookstores today: *The Power of Positive Thinking*. It was one of my dad's favorite books. He was basically a salesman, and he frequently tried to convince me that these same tenets would work for me as well. As octogenarians, we have lived a long life—and some of us are good at "being old"—so perhaps a few of us need a little tune-up to get the most out of our lives. We could start by thinking about the positives in our current lives; and if you really think about it, there are many aspects of our lives that are good, maybe even great.

The other book that my dad referred to often was the Bible. He was the son of an old-time Methodist minister, so the Bible was part of his growing up—and he made sure that it was part of my growing up too. My dad's attitude was that "the best is yet to come" only if you take charge of your lives. So when we are down, discouraged, or just wondering why you're still here, I recommend both of these books, for "Whoever puts his trust in God's Son will not be lost but will have life that lasts forever." (John 3:16b)


## What's In the Safe?? Our Conclusion.....

After drilling 4 holes to insert a scope camera, we're satisfied that the safe is empty, with only a church secretary (Edna Henning) note taped to the inside (January 1954). The note indicated there were some treasurer records, consistory minutes, cancelled checks and receipts ranging from 1875-1952.

In a few months, the locksmith will return to open the combination lock, now that he's seen inside of the lock just to be certain nothing is hidden where we didn't see with the scope camera. We suspect that the safe was emptied of its contents at the time of construction of our 1957 major addition, which included the walk-in safe. After opening it, the safe will be removed and scrapped.


